Benefits >>>>>

The benefits of the Members-In-Transition Program are:

- » Florida City and County Management Association (FCCMA) membership dues waived for a period of three fiscal years.
- » Financial assistance to attend the FCCMA annual conference and winter institute.
- » Interim employment through recommendations from colleagues or Range Riders.
- » Organized effort of colleague support through the MIT Committee, Board of Directors and Range Riders.
- » Florida League of Cities and Florida Association of Counties membership directories available upon request, as long as supplies last.
- » Jobs posted on the FCCMA Web site, www.fccma.org

History >>>>>

For many years, the FCCMA has supported its Members-In-Transition. The city and county management field is such that managers may find themselves out of work for long periods of time. This program provides support from colleagues, the opportunity to continue to participate in FCCMA business and educational seminars, and information regarding job opportunities or interim positions.

The responsibility for coordinating and administering all MIT services is centralized at the FCCMA administrative offices in Tallahassee.

Eligibility >>>>>

Any full member of the FCCMA in good standing whose last professional position held was in the local government sector is eligible for MIT benefits. The members must be actively seeking employment by pursuing local government positions throughout Florida and/or in other states, provinces or countries having members of a professional local government management association. Members-In-Transition will be allowed to stay on the MIT list for three years.

Responsibilities of the MIT >>>>>

The member who becomes in transition should:

- » Inform FCCMA staff or a fellow manager of unemployment and provide contact information.
- » Complete the "Survey of Executive Qualifications and Interest in Interim Work" and provide a resume to FCCMA staff for possible job opportunities.
- » Keep FCCMA staff informed of employment status.
- » Keep a positive attitude, and remember that usually this is not the result of anything the manager did "wrong."
- » Devote the same time, effort and professionalism to the task of finding a new job as would be devoted to managing a city or county.
