St. Johns County, Florida



- Third most northern county in Florida
- Population: 335,000 according to the 2024 US Census
- Tourism is one of St. Johns County's primary economic engines with approximately 6.5 million visitors annually.
- Visitors spends more than \$2.4 billion annually.
- In 2023, the age-adjusted rate of deaths from drug poisoning in St. Johns County was 18.7 per 100,000, compared to Florida's rate of 30.8 per 100,000.
- Overdose deaths are the 2nd leading cause of death after falls in St. Johns County when categorized as accidents.

Okaloosa County

- Third most western county in Florida panhandle
- Tourism and military are economic drivers
- Population: 221,806
- District 1 Medical Examiner (four western counties) ranked first in per capital opioid-related deaths in 2022 (42 deaths per 100,000 vs. 21 state of Florida average)
- Not a Qualified County (< 300k)
- Not required to have a taskforce for settlement use decisions
- Northwest Florida Health Network Managing Entity
 - All settlement funds flow through NWFHN to the County <u>except</u> for City/County Direct settlement funds









Annual Rates per 100,000 by Calendar Year - St. Johns County


